9. Target group :

Participants will be teachers or advisors of languages from primary, secondary and higher education. "Languages" could include any kind of new language learning. Priority will be given to participants who are prepared to share some past or ongoing work in the field (even quite modest examples welcome).

10. Focus of the training activity : Rationale and Aims

The learning of other languages is critical for the citizens of the 21st century. Through languages they will have access to work and leisure opportunities in an increasingly mobile world. They will also learn to understand the complex realities and changing identities of our multilingual societies.

This workshop will examine in particular this second aspect - the ways that language learning can enhance individual understanding, support greater social cohesion and underpin mutual respect and tolerance. We will consider how the intercultural elements of language learning can be taught in different contexts, and how they might be evaluated. We will ask questions about the value of such "soft skills" – to the individual, to the economy and to society. We will share experiences from across Europe (and beyond) and seek to establish common ground and guidelines for teachers about the impact of languages on future citizens.

Content

The workshop will include plenary sessions from a policy maker and a researcher working in the field of multilingualism and intercultural understanding. The terms of reference will include not only "foreign" language teaching but also the teaching of English and community languages. This will provide a framework for discussion and debate.

We will also hear the perspectives of some key stakeholders – for example employers, civil society representatives. (Head) teachers and young people about the value (or otherwise) of languages.

Since the workshop is also intended to have practical outcomes there will be opportunities to visit London schools to observe examples of teaching, to discuss with other practitioners and provide evidence of what can be done.

Finally the participants themselves will be invited to present examples of work they have done – reports, activities, projects – in this field.

11. Outcomes

Participants will take away examples of teaching and assessment approaches in this area. We will also seek to establish a shared and agreed rationale – guidelines for future work – which will be distributed as a Workshop report subsequent to the event.

Participants will also be encouraged and enabled to establish ongoing links which could lead to further collaborative work in the future.
